Thanks to all who purchased one or more of the calendars. The proceeds go towards helping with several of National's programs throughout the year.


Christmas

Outreach of those serving, family connections, donations of items obtained, mailing instructions and other necessary preparations occurred throughout the months between the two "outreach service ministries." Fr. Vincent Capodanno Post 1974 graciously thanked all members of the Post and St. James Parish for its corporal works of mercy and prayer for those serving out country and their families.





Another thing that was going on the past couple of months we conducted another project. We wanted to somehow thank our military chaplains. Activities/Supporting our Troops/ Youth Activities- Post
members, St. James Catholic School 6-8 graders, and
elementary children wrote letters to those men and deacons
who are in formation for the Priesthood and Catholic
Chaplaincy wrote "Thank-You" letters to current 350 Catholic
Chaplains serving all our Troops in the United States and
abroad in varying countries and territories, providing postage
for all letters, after receiving approval from the Archdiocese for
the Military Services, USA. Another project was the Christmas
Care Packages to 11 service men and women presenting
serving in the Armed Forces. A heartfelt thanks to Fr. Michael
C.PP. S. for his leadership and members of St. James Parish
in Liberty, MO.

Other Fr. Vincent R. Capodanno, MM Post 1974 actions shared with members present and members in other cities and states all shared in the participation, actions, prayer, in these events as well as other actions our Post performs. Additional Post 1974 activities shared and discussed for comments,

suggestions on how to make better, were the following: Fr. Vincent R. Capodanno New Patch Program sponsored by Capodannoguild.org. Additional activities completed within the past few months were parish salute and tribute musical program, veteran outreach community programs-part of KC, MO VA Medical Center veteran outreach program-Veterans Wish List and volunteerism, periodic Masses for Veterans patients in Hospitals, military personnel and families, and Masses prayed for deceased members and family members.

- Next discussed was the planning of the Fr. Vincent R. Capodanno, Mm Presentation in the Diocese of Kansas City-St. Joseph. A team is being formed within the Post and diocese, along with other Priests, Deacons, and others. Discussion of date, timeline of preparation and time of program and Mass were discussed, including the location of Pope Pius X High School. As the TEAM develops and assistance occurs during the upcoming weeks and months, prayer is asked of everyone. VA to pay for all emergency mental health care starting 20220117

Starting Jan. 17, veterans in acute suicidal crisis will be able to go to any VA or non-VA health care facility for emergency health care at no cost-including inpatient or crisis residential care for up to 30 days and outpatient care for up to 90 days. Veterans do not need to be enrolled in the VA system to use this benefit.

This expansion of care will help prevent veteran suicide by guaranteeing no cost. world-class care to veterans in times of crisis. It will also increase access to acute suicide care for up to 9 million veterans who are not currently enrolled in VA.

Preventing veteran suicide is VA's top clinical priority and a top priority of the Biden-Harris Administration. This effort is a key part of VA's 10-year National Strategy for Preventing Veteran Suicide and the Biden-Harris administration's plan for Reducing Military and Veteran Suicide. In September, VA released the 2022 National Veteran Suicide Prevention Annual Report, which showed that veteran suicides decreased in 2020 for the second year in a row, and that fewer veterans died by suicide in 2020 than in any year since 2006.

"Veterans in suicidal crisis can now receive the free, world-class emergency health care they deserve- no matter where they need it, when they need it, or whether they're enrolled in VA care," said VA Secretary for Veterans Affairs Denis McDonough. 'This expansion of care will save veterans' lives, and there's nothing more important than that."

VA has submitted an interim final rule to the federal register to establish this authority under section 201 of the Veterans Comprehensive Prevention, Access to Care, and Treatment (COMPACT) Act of 2020. The final policy, which takes effect on Jan. 17, will allow VA to:


Provide, pay for, or reimburse for treatment of eligible individuals' emergency suicide care, transportation costs, and fallow-up care at a VA or non-VA facility for up to 30 days of inpatient care and

90 days of outpatient care. Make appropriate referrals for are following the period of emergency suicide care. Determine eligibility for other VA services and benefits.

AMS USA

The AMS USA app is a great way for military Catholics to stay connected to the Archdiocese for the Military Services, USA. Users can find content related to the liturgical year and news about goings-on in the AMS. Mass can be livestreamed each day, and the

daily readings are available in either text or audio format. In addition to the saint of the day and access to many Catholic prayers – including the Divine Office, there is a new section of the app which highlights the National Eucharistic Revival. Here military Catholics can find resources to help them encounter and share the love of God present in Christ Jasus in the Eucharist.



Hallow: Catholic Meditation

While not specifically created for a military userbase, the Hallow app is one that is widely downloaded and well-liked by Catholics everywhere. When users install the app, they are directed to choose areas of interest such

as the popular "Bible in a Year" reading plan or "the Rosary" and goals such as "pray more often" or "reconnect with my faith." Sessions for guided meditation, music selections, and even recorded readings for better sleep are available for listening on or of-offline. Users can reflect, journal, and set prayer routines all within the app. While some content is available in a free version, a yearly subscription of \$59.99 per year (or a monthly subscription of \$3.99) gives users full access.
