If you are interested, write ONE check for the total amount and make it out to the post and mail it to the post along with the application. I will then send in the right amount to the national office. We do not have a department or chapter yet, so the post gets half of the amount that would be due.

National Convention

The National Convention is coming up soon, August 20 - 25, 2018, Pittsburg, PA. Miss Ann Roberts will be representing our post this year, I cannot financially afford to go. So far, I have heard of only one item of importance that should be coming up for a vote.

Posts like ours that are in states that do not have a department are at a disadvantage in that information that is discussed and/or voted on at a convention and national board meetings seem to never get to those posts. What is going to be proposed is that

there be assigned a department for the various regions. The regions would consist of those states in certain areas, like northeast, southeast, etc. The commander would be assigned by the national board, or national commander, and would have the responsibility of relaying information to the various posts as also obtaining opinion or concerns from the posts to present to the national board. I think it is worth a try, depending upon what criteria they use to select the person to be the regional commander. We shall see.

Heart of America Stand Down for Homeless Veterans

On June 8th, Ann Roberts and I set up our post table at St. Michaels Vet Center for the 26th annual Vet Stand Down. These are very interesting events and they give us the opportunity to meet veterans and representatives from other service agencies from throughout the Kansas City area.

We recently received the statistics from the event:

486 people attended Stand Down

- 433 were Veterans (31 females, 402 males) and 25 were OEF/OIF/OND Veterans.
- 29 family members attended, 8 of which were children.
- 24 non- Veteran visitors attended.

Of the 433 Veterans:

10% (47) reported verifiable homelessness, 45% (195) reported being permanently housed and 43% (185) housing status was not verified/identified.

Of the 47 verified as homeless:

57% (26) report chronic homelessness.

16% (4) of the OEF/OIF/OND Veterans reported current homelessness.

> 4% (2) of the homeless are female 32 % (15) are living on the street/car,

68% (32) are in shelters

23% (11) of homeless are new to Stand Down

Post Name

Our post has been named after Father Vincent Robert Capodanno, MM. He was a navy chaplain who gave his life while serving the marines during Operation Swift. His biographical timeline goes something like this:

13 February 1929 - Born in Staten Island NY

13 February 1939 – Received news of his father's death on his tenth birthday

January 1943 – Graduated from 8th grade, Public School 44

04 February 1947 -Graduated Curtis High School **1947 – 1949** – Attended Fordham :University and worked on Wall Street

May 1949 – June 1957 – Attended seminary in Ossinging NY

14 June 1958 – Ordained a Maryknoll priest **1958** – **1965** – Served as missionary in Taiwan and Hong Kong

28 December 1965 - Commissioned in U.S. Navy Chaplain Corps

16 March 1966 – Arrived for training in Newport RI and Camp Pendleton, CA

Holy Week 1966 - Arrived in Vietnam

30 April 1966 – Reported for duty and assigned to 1st Battalion 7th Marines

03 July 1967 – Reported to 3rd Battalion 5th Marines **04 September 1967** – Killed in action during Operation Swift

07 January 1969 – Awarded Medal of Honor
17 November 1973 - USS Capodanno commissioned
21 May 2006 - Declared Servant of God

Veteran Honor Flight

For those of you who have never heard of Veteran Honor Flight, here is what it is all about.

In the Kansas City Missouri area there are two organizations, Heartland Honor Flight and Honor Flight of Kansas City. Each of these organizations, as a what to say "Thank You" for serving our country. What they do is take a group of veterans, fly them to Washington, D.C., then take them to many memorials throughout our Capitol.

I had the honor of going on one in October of last year. The day started out early in the morning at KCI aiorport with registration and breakfast – lots and lots of food and drink. We boarded an American Line plane reserved only for the veterans and flew to Reagan Airport in DC.

As we were taxiing to the gate we were met by two fire trucks who proceeded to give us a water canon salute. Then we boarded buses and it was off to the various memorials, WWII, Womens Musieum, a stop at Arllington Cemetery for the changing of the guard at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier with a front row view, Vietnam Wall, Korean War, Women Combat Nurses, Air Force Memorial, etc.

After a full day, it was back to the airport and our flight home. As we left the plane and endered the terminal, there was an aisle with hundreds of people there to welcome us home.

All of this is totally free of charge for the veteran.
