If you have made landfall, on the horizon a speck


When you have secured the decks, for the night to tum in When you have mustered at sunrise, seen a new day begin When you have dogged down the hatches. in mountainous sea

Back in 1966 I experienced my first cruise to the South Pacific. I was just a twenty-one year old kid. It was during this cruise that I was promoted to E-4, 3rd class petty officer. We had two objectives, giving equal time to each.

One objective was serving as plane guard for returning planes to their carrier after making strikes in Vietnam. During this cruise, while acting as plane guard for the USS Franklin D. Roosevelt we witnessed a midair collision, losing both pilots. We also was with the USS Oriskany to render assistance if needed as they battled a massive fatal fire on board. They lost 46 lives.

The other objective was to render fire support to our ground forces. Below is a photo of our 5in. 38 guns firing at enemy troops.

DECREE Archdiocese for the Military Services, USA

After having consulted with the Holy See, my brother bishops and the faithful, I have verified the widespread reputation of sanctity enjoyed by the late Reverend Vincent Robert Capodamo, of the Society of the Foreign Missions, and Chaplain, United States Navy.

During his life and growing ever stronger after his death, there has been ample evidence of the granting of graces and favors by God through his intercession.

Therefore, I, Edwin Frederick O'Brien, Archbishop for the Military Services, USA, do hereby make public the petition of Father Daniel Mode, the postulator of this cause, and thus declare I am initiating the Cause for Beatification and Canonization of the

Servant of God Vincent Robert Capodanno.

In conformity with "The Norms to be Observed in Inquiries Made by Bishops in the Causes of Saints," published by the Congregation for the Causes of Saints on February 7, 1983, I also call upon any and all, who may have useful information regarding the Cause of Beatification and Canonization of Vincent Robert Capodanno to bring such documents, materials or information to my attention.
