The month of August

We celebrate two of our members who are honored this month. First of all, at our national convention to be held August 22 – 27 in Baltimore MD., our own Ann Puck will receive CWV's highest aware The Order of St. Sebastian. This is awarded for life time achievement. Needless to say, she has worked hard all her life.

It was either late 2014 or early 2015 at a conference of the Department of Missouri of the American Legion that I met Ann. We were both in the hospitality room of the Navy Club of Missouri. I believe she had the CWV patch on the jacket she was wearing, and I had belonged to CWV prior to our meeting, but had dropped out due to nothing going on in my state.

We started talking about CWV and she had this wild idea about starting a post in the Kansas City area. So, I rejoined CWV and we started investigating the process necessary to start a post. It takes 15 members to form a post, so we began recruiting people. Then came the process of selecting a name.

We were visiting the WWI memorial on Memorial Day, 2015. As we were looking at the various plaques around the front of the memorial we came across the Vietnam plaque which listed the various thing and military units involved in the war and out popped the name, Vincent Robert Capodanno, Navy chaplain, KIA, MOH recipient. Then, after a letting investigating we discovered that he had also been declared Servant of God, first step in being declared a saint. All of this because Ann got a wild idea to form a post.

Another event that is going on is that one of our members, Shon Pernice, has been named Patriot of the Year by the Patriots of Valor magazine. Shon is presently incarcerated at the Moberly Correctional Center. So, his accomplishments were undertaken while incarcerated. Here is one of the support letters sent to Patriots of Valor:

Now, meet Shon, an Iraqi Army Veteran...

Shon was nominated for the award by John Stockdall. John has known Shon for 5 years. In his nomination, John wrote:

Shon has a passion for helping Veterans and non-Veterans alike. He worked to get VA Health Care Benefits for me and others. Shan submitted paperwork to the Department of Defense and had me awarded the US Navy Expeditionary Medal - I had no idea I even qualified for it. Not only that, but he worked to get me and others the Missouri Veterans Medal and Medallion - a feat unheard of prior to his efforts. He has and leads projects and activities that give Veterans a purpose. As an example, he started a clothing program for Veterans leaving here and that has positively affected many Veterans. Last year, he arranged and coordinated "The Murph Challenge" that brought together many diverse offenders and honored fallen military members. In terms of Leadership traits, Shan has been the President of our local VVA chapter and is the voice for incarcerated veterans through his many published writings: -He has facilitated several care packages and card writing projects for deployed troops through Operation Support Our Troops and "thank you" cards for sick and wounded military through Operation Quiet Comfort. He continues to find opportunities to be involved in community efforts. Just a couple of his recent projects involved a hygiene collection for Afghanistan Refugees in Central Missouri and he orchestrated a program to collect candy for the children at the local community kitchen.


