As you may know, the Sergeant First Class Heath Robinson Honoring our Promise to Address Comprehensive Toxics (PACT) Act of 2022 has been signed into law.

This historic new law expands VA health care and benefits for Veterans exposed to burn pits and other toxic substances. It empowers VA to provide generations of Veterans – and their survivors – with the care and benefits they have earned.

On Monday, June 5, 2023, from 2:30 p.m. to 5:30 p.m., you are invited to join Kansas City VA Medical Center at the Spring Hill Civic Center, 401 N Madison St., Spring Hill, KS 66083, for KCVA's next PACT Act Town Hall awareness event.

We will provide an overview of the PACT Act, how it will help VA serve Veterans, explain the newly expanded health care and benefits options outlined in the law, and answer any questions you may have. Additionally, we will offer onsite toxic exposure screenings and registration/enrollment services and provide a host of Veteran Service Officers (VSO) claim support. ### "Servant of God Father Vincent R. Capodanno Merit Service Award."

Introduction, Purpose and Explanation of the "Servant of God Father Vincent R. Capodanno Merit Service Award

"For I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me drink, a stranger and you welcomed me, naked and you clothed me, ill, and you cared for me, in prison and you visited me" (Mt. 25:35-36). He said to them, "You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind," and "...You shall love your neighbor as yourself." (Mt. 22:37-39).

This Catholic War Veterans, USA National Welfare Officer "Servant of God Father Vincent R. Capodanno Service Merit Award" recognizes and honors the exemplary service of an individual Catholic War Veterans member, Priest, Catholic Chaplain, Religious Order person, or lay Catholic person whom by their Catholic actions

of Corporal Spiritual and Physical Works of Mercy outlined and described in the Catholic War Veterans, USA Welfare Officer Program.

This religious activity honors those men and women who lead heroic lives of faith. Their words, their deeds, actions, and their devotion to prayer and to the sacraments, inspire all American Catholics, Military personnel, Veterans and their families. This Merit Service Award would also recognize, honor, and show how learning, praying, sacrificing and caring for others physical, mental, emotional, and spiritual needs is evidenced in servant leadership through the life and sacrifice of Father Vincent Capodanno.

By following the 'criteria and qualifications' outlined in Parts A and B, and Nomination Procedures, an individual, Priest, Catholic Chaplain, Catholic Lay Person, or Religious Order person will be awarded the Servant of God Father Vincent R. Capodanno merit Service Award at a time designated at the National Catholic War Veterans, USA Convention.

### Servant of God Father Vincent R. Capodanno Merit Service Award

"For I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me drink, a stranger and you welcomed me, naked and you clothed me, ill, and you cared for me, in prison and you visited me" (Mt. 25:35-36). He said to them, "You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind," and "...You shall love your neighbor as yourself." (Mt. 22:37-39).

The Catholic Military, Veteran, Catholic War Veterans, USA Member, Lay Person/Civilian, Priest, Chaplain, or Religious Brother or Sister are persons worthy of the "Servant of God Father Vincent R. Capodanno Merit Service Award" for their exemplary service to God, Country, and Home in accordance Catholic Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy outlined in the criteria stated below. The 'Nomination Committee' will send out the criteria and nomination procedures for the above-named Merit Service Award, evaluate and provide the recommendation made to the Body of Catholic War Veterans, USA members for the calendar year.

(Part A) Merit Award Service Criteria- The recipient would complete the ten (10) below criteria of which their three (3) endorsers donated on the "Nomination Form." To be considered for the "Servant of God Father Vincent R. Capodanno Merit Service Award" the nominee demonstrated exceptional volunteer service in the Spirit of Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy in the way of Christ Jesus, and in Communion of Holy Mother Church and the Saints.

- 1. Have distinguished himself/herself in an explementary manner by contributing the/a 'religious program in a/their parish, or if based on a 'military installation' in their Catholic Chapel Religious Program-overseas or in a Diocese.
- 2. Be of good character, exemplary conduct, and have a good reputation in the community, Catholic War Veterans, USA community, Post, Chapter and Department.
- 3. If married, have received the Sacrament of Matrimony.
- 4. Serve the Church, Catholic War Veterans, USA without recompense in the following manner as outlined for the 'Servant of God Father Vincent R. Capodanno

Merit Service Award.'

- 5. Possess an outstanding character/behavior/reputation in all respects.
- 6. Motivated by religious values in one's daily life.
- 7. Practice your Catholic faith often.
- 8. Provide good example to others.
- 9. Held in high esteem by your peers and community.
- 10. Faithful to official Church teaching.

(Part B) Merit Award Service Criteria – The recipient would complete one (1) of the following criteria:

- 1. Have provided 'spiritual care for veterans (military) serving our nation and/or, their families either in a parish, out in a community by visiting a Veterans Administration (VA) Medical Center-Hospital, or invite a veteran or family member to attend a prayer service or Holy Mass.
- 2. Have participated in a Seminar for 'Suicide Prevention' moral injury and share one's faith with another veteran in their moment of crisis.
- 3. Over a period of time visited home-bound veterans of those with, or without spouses, and/or children in (VA) operated homes, or their private residence, or community government housing.
- 4. Visits a veteran's' family when he/she becomes ill, or anytime when asked, or takes a veteran to a post meeting when he/she is unable to provide own transportation, or to and disabled veteran event, or adopt a military family in a parish or their spiritual or physical needs

Several years ago Ann came up with the idea of having a national aware in honor of Father Capodanno. Over the past several years she has worked with many national officers, department commanders, fellow members from various posts, etc. When this finally becomes the award she seeks, all the credit is hers. She never gave up.

This, in my humble opinion, is a much needed award, especially an award in honor of a great man, a servant of God, who gave his life administering to wounded and dying Marines in Vietnam.
