making our communities a place where God enters people's lives through prayers, reconciliation, silence, Eucharist,, community service, and where one strives to make Jesus Christ more known and loved through our actions and words.

*Such mission volunteer work include: support for needy military and veteran families, military families with a KIA military family member, visiting those in hospice and in hospitals.
