John began volunteering nearly 20 years ago when his parents were residents of Our Lady of Mercy Country Home.

Over the years, he has mowed the grass, handled light maintenance chores and painted: "There's not a wall in this building that I haven't painted or a blade of grass I haven't cut."

"John works about 16 hours Tuesday through Friday every week during lunch periods which is a hugh commitment," Connie

John often goes the extra mile by serving at special events such as meetings of Our Lady of Mercy Auxiliary or at memorial services.

"When he serves at special events, he always makes sure he is dressed in a full suit and tie because he doesn't 'feel it is respectful' to give residents and guests anything less," Connie said.



I have always volunteered at various places throughout my life, and have enjoyed most of it. When I began at Our Lady of Mercy Country Home in Liberty, I was totally different. It was shortly after my parents had moved in there. One day I asked the administrator, Debbie Trimmer, if they needed any help. I know, that was a silly question. I decided to work with the maintenance crew. During the summer I worked outside cutting grass, painting the building where it needed it, etc. When winter arrived it was inside. I cleaned all the tiled floors, painted walls, helped where ever I was needed.

Christmas time was something else. We installed Chrstmas lights outlining the entire building and all of the trees that were lining road. Christmas trees went up everywhere.

Now, when Covid hit, everything was shut down. I no longer had my second home.

When Covid finally let up I received an email saying they needed help in the dining room. I though to myself that I would give it a try. Over the period of covid, almost all of the staff changed. Prior to coming back, I really did not care for the head chef in the kitchen. So I was somewhat leary of working there.

Well, there was this guy there named Victor and two other guys, Salvadore and Jesus. What a fantastic crew.

I am so glad that God led me to where I am now. I would have never believed that I could possibly love so many people do deeply as I do now, The love and concern that I have for the residents and staff is unbeliveable.

No matter what your age, think about helping out some where, there are so many places that can use and need people to help out. And, believe me, the benefits far out weigh the "work".
